

Specific Instructions: The two questions below are **designed to identify your ethnicity and race**. Regardless of your answer to question 1, go to question 2.

Question 1. Are You Hispanic or Latino?

(A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.) Yes No

Question 2. Please select the racial category or categories with which you **most closely identify by** placing an “X” in the appropriate box. Check as many as apply.

RACIAL CATEGORY (Check as many as apply)	DEFINITION OF CATEGORY
<input type="checkbox"/> American Indian or Alaska Native	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.
<input type="checkbox"/> Asian	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.
<input type="checkbox"/> Black or African American	A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.
<input type="checkbox"/> Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
<input type="checkbox"/> White	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa

Note – The two questions separate Ethnicity and race:

Question 1 – Yes is the usual response for all Spanish speaking populations as the primary language of their country of origin.

Question 2 –Response will vary depending on the race that most closely identifies an individual

Most common groups are: Asian, Black, or White

Hispanics/Mexicans are generally from European (Spanish) decent racially described as White.

However, individually, a Mexican family could closely identify with other races as listed.
