State Employee Recognition Week is May 2 - 6

Georgia's annual State Employee Recognition Week (SERW) will be observed May 2-6, 2016; and in concert with the celebration, several activities have been planned for our DECAL staff.

"The purpose of this week is to honor the thousands of loyal and hard-working individuals who make up the state's workforce," said Robin Stevens, DECAL Director of Human Resources. "DECAL is made up of more than 350 outstanding men and women dedicated to supporting parents, teachers and providers, and who know that investing in our youngest learners is critical to the long-term economic growth and potential of Georgia. During this particular week, we acknowledge the passion and drive of our employees who work so diligently to achieve and maintain the reputation of excellence our agency has earned."

Stevens said the DECAL Employee Advisory Group (EAG) brainstormed several suggestions and chose to sponsor the following events for the participation and pleasure of their colleagues:

- Casual Dress: Dress more leisurely throughout the week, unless conducting appointments with external clients.
- Virtual Bouquet: Express your appreciation of a fellow employee (based in the field or Atlanta office) to acknowledge their work, support, help, and guidance by sending a virtual bouquet of flowers with a personalized note.
- *CALi's "Pet-A-Like" Photo Contest: Submit photos of yourself with your own dog, cat or other household pet(s) to our agency's new mascot, CALi, who with the assistance of her two legged friends, will determine which DECAL employees look most like their favorite pet(s).
- Candy Grams: Recognize and treat a DECAL employee(s) with the delivery of a pre-ordered candy or alternative snack.

Education Empowerment Zone (E3Z), Valerie Blackmon spends much of her work day promoting Quality Rated.

E3Zs are regions of the state that work with DECAL and other state agencies to promote early education system reform initiatives and partnerships that support better outcomes for young children. An important

"Some of the challenges I face is the lack of family and public awareness about Quality Rated; motivating child care learning and family home learning providers to complete the QR process; and (needing) a strong QR marketing plan to increase family and public knowledge," she said.

In April, the Georgia Early Education Alliance for Ready Students (GEEARS) and DECAL introduced a statewide public awareness campaign for Quality Rated, and Blackmon believes the more that can be done in that regard, the better. If named DECAL Commissioner for a day, Blackmon said she would "find a donor to cover a marketing campaign for Quality Rated and its benefits to run every day, 24 hours a day."

In addition to working with the Child Care Resource and Referral team to develop strategies to promote Quality Rated, a typical day on the job for Blackmon involves attending meetings of the Early Learning Network, the Education Commission and the Quality Rated Peer Support Network; connecting providers with community resources or services; gathering data for community leaders; and distributing flyers regarding events or meetings.

Blackmon, who began working for DECAL in February 2015, said what she enjoys most about her job is "sharing with other community stakeholders and families the importance of quality child care settings, collaborating to develop sustainable and replicable systems within the community, and working with the local school system to support children's development and learning."

When not on the job, Blackmon enjoys calligraphy, writing, coloring, and cooking. The Texas native has three children - Billy Jr., Andrae, and Chloe - and a granddaughter, Kyla Wiley-Spears "who is my heart."

Her favorite quote is by Martin Luther King Jr.: "Intelligence plus character-that is the goal of true education."

GEEARS and DECAL Introduce New Quality Rated PSA

The Georgia Early Education Alliance for Ready Students (GEEARS) and DECAL have introduced a new statewide public awareness campaign for Quality Rated. The message of the campaign is simple: Quality Rated helps families take the mystery out of searching for child care.

We will begin sharing this message early this summer with public service announcements on television and radio throughout Georgia and through online advertisements specifically targeting families searching for child care.

Parents and families need an independent, trustworthy

resource to help them find high-quality child care, preschool and pre-K programs. That's where Georgia's Quality Rated comes in.

Quality Rated gives families greater confidence in their child care choice because they know that independent early education experts assess whether programs apply research-based best practices such as:

- Employing qualified and well-trained teachers
- Providing a safe, healthy and caring environment
- Implementing individualized instruction
- Offering a curriculum that prepares kids for kindergarten
- Including focuses on both active learning and social-emotional development
- Engaging families
- Providing a low teacher-student radio

children unattended in vehicles. Officials hope a new video, set to premiere at a Tuesday, May 31, 2016 news conference at the State Capitol, will help prevent children's heatstroke deaths this summer.

"During our state's hot summer months, there is a higher risk of serious injury or death as a result of a child being left alone inside a vehicle," Governor Deal stated at last year's event. "I ask all Georgians to join me in preventing future loss of life by being aware of your surroundings and never leaving a child in a car, even for just a minute. Lives can be saved if we take the time to Look Again."

Commissioner Jacobs said over 370,000 children in Georgia are cared for daily by approximately 5,000 child care centers most of whom regularly transport children."When we receive calls about incidents where children are left in vehicles, we investigate each incident," Jacobs explained.

Jacobs said "Look Again" is a message not just to child care programs and teachers but to anyone caring for a child -- parents and grandparents, other family members, neighbors and friends -- to always account for the children in their care as they drive them from place to place. "When you arrive at your destination, check the front and back of your car, and after you've looked, just to be sure, look again. There is absolutely no reason for a child to suffer or die in these conditions," she stressed.

Officials ask the public to be their eyes and ears in the community, and if they see a child left alone in a vehicle, call 911 immediately; emergency personnel are trained to respond.


Fannin is First County with All Child Care Programs Participating in Quality Rated
