### It's Georgia Pre-K Week! Let the Celebration Begin

Starting today, hundreds of state and local leaders will celebrate the 25th birthday of Georgia's Pre-K Program by reading to Georgia's youngest learners from October 2-6 as part of Georgia Pre-K Week 2017.

Governor Zell Miller launched Georgia's lottery-funded Pre-K program in 1992 as a pilot program serving 750 four-year-old children. Since then, Georgia's Pre-K Program has laid a solid foundation for academic excellence and future success in the lives of approximately 1.6 million children. Now in its seventh year, Georgia Pre-K Week is coordinated by Voices for Georgia's Children, a policy and advocacy non-profit organization. The goal of Pre-K week is to emphasize the importance of quality early childhood education by providing opportunities for leaders to engage with Pre-K classrooms in local communities.

Georgia Power and Synovus return as presenting sponsors of Georgia Pre-K Week for the fourth consecutive year. Additional key supporters include Governor Nathan Deal and First Lady Sandra Deal, state commissioners, state and local elected officials, and other dignitaries.

"The broad and diverse base of support from around our state is evidence that Georgia's leaders care about and understand the long-term impact of quality early learning on each child," said Dr. Erica Fener Sitkoff, Executive Director of Voices for Georgia's Children. "Research consistently shows that children entering kindergarten from quality early learning settings are more prepared and ready to learn, which our leaders see first-hand during Pre-K Week."

During the week, countless state, business and community leaders will visit Pre-K centers to witness early learning in action. While there, each will read a favorite children's book to the classes. Since Pre-K Week began, nearly three out of every four state legislators and nearly half of Georgia's congressional delegation have participated in the event.

"We are grateful to see Georgia's state and local leaders celebrate this landmark year for Georgia's Pre-K Program," said Amy M. Jacobs, Commissioner of DECAL, which administers Georgia's Pre-K Program and licenses and monitors the state's child care learning centers. "By participating in Pre-K Week activities, our leaders show parents and the public that they value quality early education and its impact on students, families and our state."

### DECAL and Naserian Foundation Name Georgia's Pre-K Program 2017-2018 Teachers of the Year

DECAL and the Naserian Foundation have named two outstanding educators as Georgia's Pre-K Program Teachers of the Year for 2017-2018. The winners are Jodi McNamara from Kids R Kids #49 in Lawrenceville and Nathan Leatherwood from Calhoun Pre-K.

DECAL names two teachers each year, one from a public school system and one from a private child care center, representing the public-private model through which the Pre-K program is delivered. McNamara and Leatherwood will serve as ambassadors for Georgia's Pre-K Program, making presentations, attending meetings, and modeling effective classroom practices.

"Georgia's Pre-K Program is only as successful and effective as the dedicated women and men who work with Georgia's four year olds every day," said DECAL Commissioner Amy M. Jacobs, These awards are a small way for us to recognize their efforts. We congratulate Jodi and Nathan and look forward to working with them this school year. We also thank Connie Ellington of Bethlehem Elementary School in Barrow County and Channie Frazier of Kids World Learning Center in Bulloch County for their outstanding job serving as our very first Pre-K Teachers of the Year in 2016-2017."

This school year, while celebrating its 25th birthday, approximately 84,000 four year olds are attending Georgia's Pre-K Program. The voluntary, lottery-funded Pre-K program has been recognized as one of the top programs in the nation, based on quality standards, teacher qualifications, and enrollment. Georgia's Pre-K Program is universal - meaning that any age eligible child residing in Georgia may attend the program regardless of family income.

Susan Adams, Assistant Commissioner for Georgia's Pre-K Program and Instructional Services said, "DECAL appreciates this opportunity to recognize the commitment of our Pre-K teachers who work every day all over the state to ensure that Georgia's children have a great Pre-K experience. The quality of the teacher in the classroom determines the quality of the classroom instruction."

Earlier this year, six finalists for Georgia's Pre-K Program Teachers of the Year were announced. This fall, all of them were interviewed and underwent a classroom evaluation. They were also visited by Commissioner Jacobs and Stephanie Blank, CEO of the Naserian Foundation, which is sponsoring the statewide program. Each February, DECAL invites any Georgia's Pre-K lead teacher who has taught for a minimum of three years to apply for Teacher of the Year. Applicants must also meet Georgia's Pre-K credential and Professional Development Registry requirements and plan to continue as a lead teacher for the coming year. Their school must be in good standing with all programs administered by DECAL (Pre-K, Child Care Services, Childcare and Parent Services [CAPS] and Nutrition Services).
