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Pre-K Longitudinal Study: Year One Results



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Key Findings



- Children exhibited significant growth during their Pre-K year in language, literacy, math, and behavioral skills. This shows that Pre-K is focusing on all the skills that children need as they enter Kindergarten.
- As a universal program, Georgia's Pre-K Program can offer a beneficial experience for all children, regardless of the family's income level.
- Children who were Spanish-speaking dual language learners showed growth in skills in both English and Spanish. Their growth tended to be greater in English.

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Key Findings



- Overall, Georgia's Pre-K classrooms measured in the medium quality range. While this is not as high as we would prefer, quality scores for Georgia's Pre-K are higher than those found in preschool classrooms that are not Georgia's Pre-K.
- Overall, these findings clearly support that Georgia's Pre-K Program enhances skills that help prepare children for Kindergarten.

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Longitudinal Data Study



- Year Two:
 - Includes the same classrooms from year one and implements a regression discontinuity design to include a comparison group.
 - Researchers assessed children in 90 Pre-K classrooms and 444 Kindergarten classrooms for Year Two.
 - Results should be available by December 2013.


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FY 2013-2014 Proposed Budget for Pre-K



- Proposed Governor's Budget
 - 180 Instructional Days
 - 8 Planning Days
 - Draft Rates posted on website
- Carry Over Funding
 - Carry Over from FY 12 must be expended by the end of this year
 - Carry Over for FY 13 will not be approved

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Georgia Early Learning and Development Standards (GELDS) Roll-out



- Finalizing age specific indicators
- Website is set to launch in late February for public review and feedback:
 - www.gelds.decal.ga.gov
- Working with GPB to produce statewide webinars and gather teacher modeling footage/interviews which will available on website

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GELDS Timeline



- February 2013: Public comment on standards
- June 2013: GELDS finalized and posted
- July- October 2013: Curricula Review Process
- School Year 2013-2014: Training on the new GELDS
- School Year 2014-2015: GELDS implementation required in Pre-K classrooms

- Revision of Work Sampling System Indicators
- Revision of User Interface more modern and more user friendly
