# Zoo Atlanta Celebrates Georgia's Pre-K Week

Celebration, observed October 5-9, 2015, includes discount admission for Pre-K Classes and Special Shows and Activities

**ATLANTA**, **Ga.**, (**September 21**, **2015**) – Zoo Atlanta is joining Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) again this year to honor Georgia's nationally recognized Pre-K program during Georgia's Pre-K Week **October 5-9**, **2015** presented by PNC Bank.

During this year's celebration Zoo Atlanta will offer a Self-Guided Field Trip at the discounted rate of \$9 per person and special activities that include costumed characters welcoming teachers and students as they arrive in Flamingo Plaza; Animal Tales storybook readings in Amy's Tree Theater; and a private World of Wild Theater bird show geared toward the Pre-K audience.

Viewed as one of the finest zoological institutions in the U.S. and a proud accredited member of the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA), Zoo Atlanta has a mission to inspire value and preservation of wildlife through a unique mix of education and outdoor family experiences. From well-known native wildlife to critically endangered species on the brink of extinction, the Zoo offers memorable close encounters with nearly 1,400 animals from around the world. The Zoo's newest destination, Scaly Slimy Spectacular: The Amphibian and Reptile Experience, featuring 60 species in an 111,000 square-foot complex, opened in April 2015.

Zoo collection highlights include Mei Lun and Mei Huan, the only giant panda twins in the U.S.; North America's largest zoological collections of gorillas and orangutans; and a global center of excellence for the care and study of reptiles and amphibians. Up-close-and-personal animal experiences include behind-the-scenes Wild Encounters with African elephants, giant pandas, lemurs and Aldabra giant tortoises. Zoo Atlanta is open daily with the exceptions of Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. Keeper talks, interactive wildlife shows, education programs and special events run year-round.
